A word from the Commodore

It's been a busy and fun summer with the Fourth of July Raft Up, General Membership Meeting and Big Boat Regatta. See the race results for the Regatta on our website at pointlomayc.org. Please also try to join the fun at Mariner's Cove in Mission Bay for a Labor Day Raft Up.

I want to take this opportunity to advise that Chuck King has taken over the position of Rear Commodore (as well as still assuming the position of Secretary). Thanks Chuck! The Board also voted in Jim Torian as another Director and keeps our number at 9. Thanks Jim! Ann Kinner resigned the position of Rear Commodore when she was just way to busy with two jobs, one of which is out on the water and conflicting with the dates of many of our events. Ann is still a PLYC member and I want to thank her for several years of work on the Board.

Congratulations are in order for the PLYC team that won Best Overall at the Little Race for Little People.

The Board has been very busy discussing the potential to lease space for a **PLYC Club-house** with Marina Cortez. *That's right – our very own clubhouse!* Those members who attended the July 27 General Membership Meeting also had a lot of positive input to our proposal to the Marina. I'd say at this point that we are at 95% toward signing a lease.

The space is approximately 300 square feet and located on the corner of the marina building that borders on the pool area and Harbor Island Drive. In our proposal, we also asked for first right of refusal to expand into space that may

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come available in the future. We will also get a 10% discount on the rent if paid one year in advance. The lease will include a clause that we can opt out annually.

Once the lease is signed, many things will happen.

- (1) Remodeling of the space that used to be a supply room for the restaurant upstairs. Robbie Hickethier will oversee the remodeling that will include installing a drop ceiling, fixing the walls, adding a door to face the pool area, installing a bar, etc. I'm sure Robbie could use help in the labor involved in this, as well as if anyone has materials that could be used.
- (2) Applying for a sales tax license and ABC license. Some research has already been performed in this area. If someone has had experience in applying for an ABC license, please contact me by 619-723-5117.
- (3) Furnishing the clubhouse. We hope to schedule an Open House with our members being able to see the space without furnishings. We may then be able to save some money by receiving donated items that will compliment this space.
- (4) Manning the clubhouse. We hope to be open at least three evenings a week from approximately 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and, of course, for our events. Volunteers will be needed to open, man the bar and close. A clubhouse manager will also be needed to oversee ordering of supplies and scheduling volunteers.

The funds to remodel and pay the first year's rent will come from our two CD's. We feel very confident that we will not have to use normal operating funds. However, we need your help! In order to make sure we have enough funds, we need to increase the membership. We also anticipate a dues increase effective in 2003. The more new members we bring in, the less the increase.

Therefore, I am asking all our members to talk to at least one friend about joining our club. Have them check out our Website.

Download an application from the website and have it ready for them to fill out. If even one-third of members are successful in this endeavor – that would definitely help us through the crucial first few months until the ABC license is received and we get on track to having the clubhouse pay for itself.

Nominations are due this Fall for the 2003 Board for PLYC. The staff commodores are in charge of putting together a ballot for the members by October. Please consider putting in your name for one of positions available. Contact Geff Fisher, Woody or Linda Wood, Jackie Collins, Ned Knight or Susan McGuire.

I want to thank Jim Torian for graciously offering to take over the task of the Newsletter. With Jim also handling the Website, I think this will be a good focal point for all our news to get both on Website and published in a Newsletter for mailing. I know I am very relieved as my workload was just getting too much!

That's all for now – hope to see you at the Labor Day Raft Up, the Fall General Membership Meeting (hoping to be scheduled for the opening of the Clubhouse) and the Jimmy Rogers Memorial Regatta in October!

PLYC Wins Best Overall in the Little Race For Little People By Jim Torian

The Little Race For Little People was Saturday, August 3rd. With the dedicated effort of PLYC members Rachael Collins, Bob Kearns, Ed McCoy, and Jim Torian, we were judged "Best Overall" by the race committee (thank you). Our theme this year was "We Pledge Allegiance..." with a well designed sail and coordinating t-shirts and hats. After the parade and judging, we gathered in the starting area for the traditional blessing and water fight. Shortly after the start on the first leg, the team executed the "Insta-

Bail System" suggested by Ed McCoy, by flipping the boat in shallow water, righting the boat, and continuing on. The race went counter-clockwise around Shelter Island Marina and consisted of 5 legs. Leg 2 was paddled stern first. Leg 3, paddled bow first, was the longest leg passing all of the mega yachts and was a battle of endurance, and in addition, we had to pick up a stuffed shark toy for the finish. Leg 4 was a "reach to the beach" under sail and we were allowed to use the handles of the

paddles to paddle with. Leg 5 was between the marina and shore, sailed and paddled bow first, but we had to cross the finish line stern first and toss the stuffed shark thru a balloon arch on the stern of the finish boat, which Ed did with quarterback precision.

These tools help us communicate instantly, keep our records current, respond to changes in a timely fashion, and express ourselves with more creativity. The difference today is how we use these to enhance our lives. When we invest a little time and effort, the rewards multiply.

Our computers and the Internet are the most common tools at our disposal. Beside The Point (our club newsletter), the PLYC Membership Roster, and the PLYC Website are created on computers. The ease and versatility of writing, cutting. and pasting streamlines the task of publishing, but they wouldn't exist or capture your interest without the input of our members. I strongly encourage everyone to submit articles and information to us, via the website and e-mail, to improve the quality of these publications for you. Thank you to all of our members who have contributed their efforts writing articles, posting race results, and compiling information for our membership roster.

The Internet is a major player in the conveyance of information. Our website is the center of the most current information available, but is limited in content by the contributions to the website. In order to stay up-to-date, we need to maintain a flow of input. As a member, you can assist us by sending us timely articles and announcements. Examples include Raft-up Wrap-ups and personal race results. I would also like to add a picture gallery to the PLYC Website and I solicit your pictures with a brief description, date, and the photographer's name. Our website and newsletter are done entirely in-house.

The Internet also provides us with e -mail. This allows us the convenience of instant written communication. We can notify members of upcoming events, changes, and a whole assortment of valuable information without the cost of printing and mailing. This supplements the "snail mail" that delivers the hard copy of the newsletter. 
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P.L.Y.C Raft-Up Labor Day Weekend Abalone Gulch Downwind Regatta Rescheduled for Labor Day Weekend
